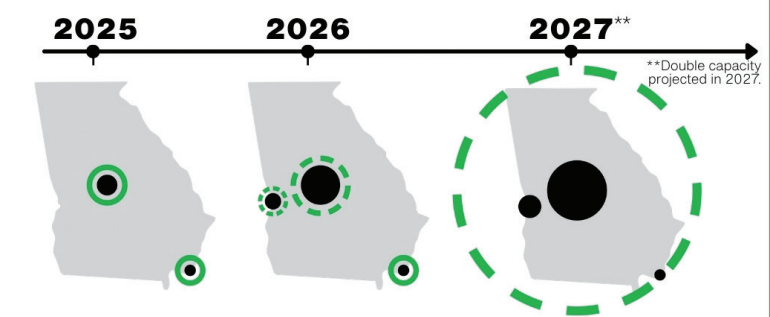

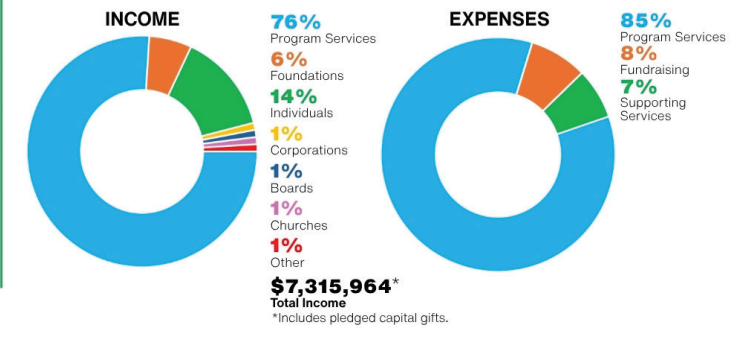

Last year, Austin led the charge helping a single mother and her children that he met while he volunteered at Macon Outreach. He felt deep empathy for her, saying, "We have to help them!" He and Cornerstone Helping Others (CHO) gave the family an Easter basket and later learned that she was fighting cancer, so he called her to check on her. That fall, CHO went back-to-school shopping for her children. Austin truly saw her the day he served her lunch, and he has not forgotten her. He continues to find new ways to support her and her family. Austin says, "My ministry, that's my heart."
